As an update to the grade realignment, the governing board voted 5-0 to move forward with the grade realignment. The timeline for the realignment will be developed and shared prior to the end of the school year, with the understanding that we must be flexible in adjusting due to facility limitations and expansions.

In reviewing facilities, the Master Planning Steering Committee continues to work diligently on a recommendation to the governing board, which is slated to occur on or before June 16, 2015. If we were to recommend a bond election in November, specific deadlines must be met from a statutory basis. We are working on creating an improved web link to assist with understanding current topics and conversations. In addition, we will have our third Master Planning Workshop on May 14, 2015 from 5:00 – 8:00 PM. We will begin solidifying plans for the 5-6 school location for a recommendation to the governing board. In reference to Treasure Mountain Junior High, we received additional health facts from the EPA and will send this to you as an individual email as well as to our parents. We continue to work collaboratively with the EPA, City and County to develop plans to do the soil mitigation around Treasure Mountain Junior High.
